Purpose

The Education Department of the Council of Europe is organising an RFCDC-Pilot Training Course (the Course) which will be held <u>online</u> for two groups on 9 - 19 May 2022 and on 27 May - 3 June 2022 respectively. The objective of the Course is to test the RFCDC Basic course. The Course is open to <u>all</u> education professionals (including administrators and policy makes) who wish to get acquainted with or improve their knowledge of the Council of Europe's Reference Framework of Competences for Democratic Culture as well as to contribute to the development of the RFCDC Training programme.

Learning outcomes

After completing the Course, participants will be able to:

- Show a critical understanding of the main concepts on which the RFCDC is based, of the CDC model and of the descriptors of competences and their role in education practice;
- Identify and analyse meaningful ways the RFCDC can be used for the design, implementation and evaluation of various types of learning activities, as well as for the assessment of learning outcomes, as part of a whole-school approach;
- Plan contextualized information- or awareness-raising activities focused on or based on the RFCDC.

Following the completion of the Course, participants are competent to apply the RFCDC in their daily practice and to become multipliers to further promote the RFCDC in their education contexts. For those already working as teacher trainers, there will be an option to take part in the full 6 months RFCDC-Training in the near future.

Format and requirements

The Pilot Training Course will be held online for two groups of **20-25 participants** each. Seats will be allocated on a <u>first-come-first-served basis</u>.

The Course consists of **19.5** hours of online synchronous sessions and additional estimated **5-6** hours of individual work. Participants are required to attend and actively participate in all synchronous sessions, and provide feedback regarding their experience with the Course. The feedback will be used to improve and finalise the RFCDC Basic course and to inform the development of the RFCDC Training programme for trainers.

Language

The working language of the Course is **English** therefore applicants should have a good command of it.

Certification

A Certificate of Attendance will be issued to participants who attend all online synchronous sessions and respond to a feedback survey after fulfilling the course

Background

The Reference Framework of Competences for Democratic Culture (RFCDC) is a set of materials produced by the Council of Europe that can be used by education systems to equip learners at all levels of education and in contexts outside formal education with the competences that are needed to take action to defend and promote human rights, democracy and the rule of law, to participate effectively in a culture of democracy, and to live peacefully together with others in culturally diverse societies.
