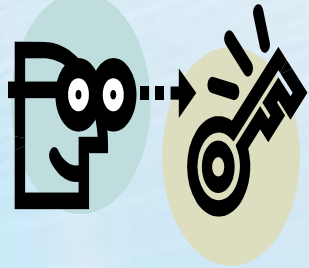

H2020 OVERVIEW

1. EU's largest legal instrument for **funding research and innovation** in Europe
2. ≈ € 80 billion for the period 2014 – 2020
3. Programmes address **Societal Challenges** (Environment, Health, Energy,...), **Industrial Leadership** and Competitiveness (ICT, Space, Nano,...), as well as **Excellence** in world leading scientists, future & emerging technologies and training & career development through mobility
4. Projects are funded through **competitive Calls-for-Proposals** and must have a "European Dimension" and "Impact"



H2020 → what's new?

A single programme bringing together three separate programmes/initiatives:
FP(7) – CIP – EIT

Coupling research to innovation
from research to retail, all forms of innovation

Focus on societal challenges facing European society e.g. Climate – Environment, Health and ageing, Energy, Transport, Security...

Simplified access, for all **companies**, universities, institutes, the young generation in all EU countries (and beyond)...



H2020 Simplification RULES

- **A single set** of simpler and more coherent participation rules
- **One project one funding rate** Maximum of 100% of the total eligible costs (except for innovation actions, where a 70% maximum will apply for profit making entities)
- **Single flat rate (25%)** for 'indirect costs'
- **8 months time-to-grant target**
- **International Participation** facilitated but better protecting EU interests

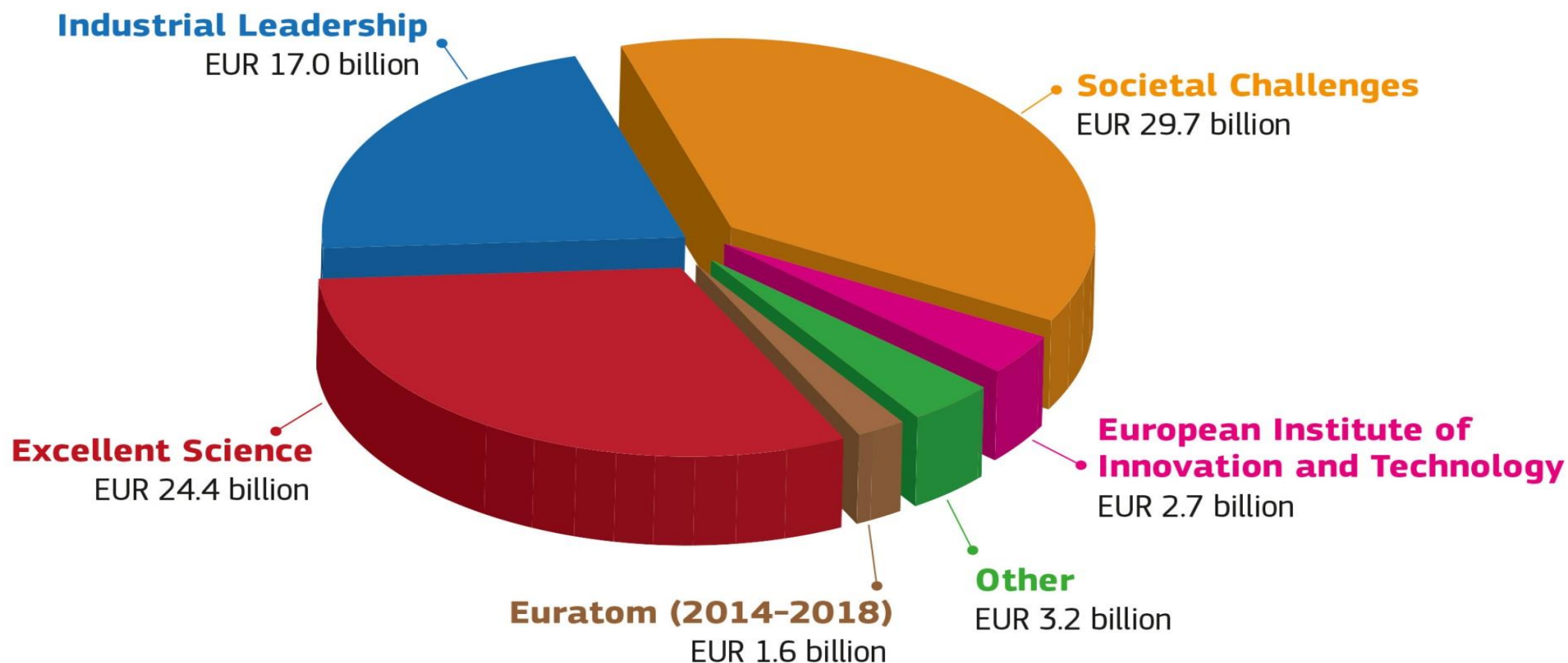

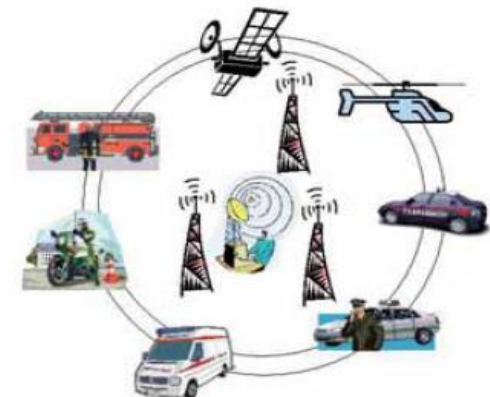

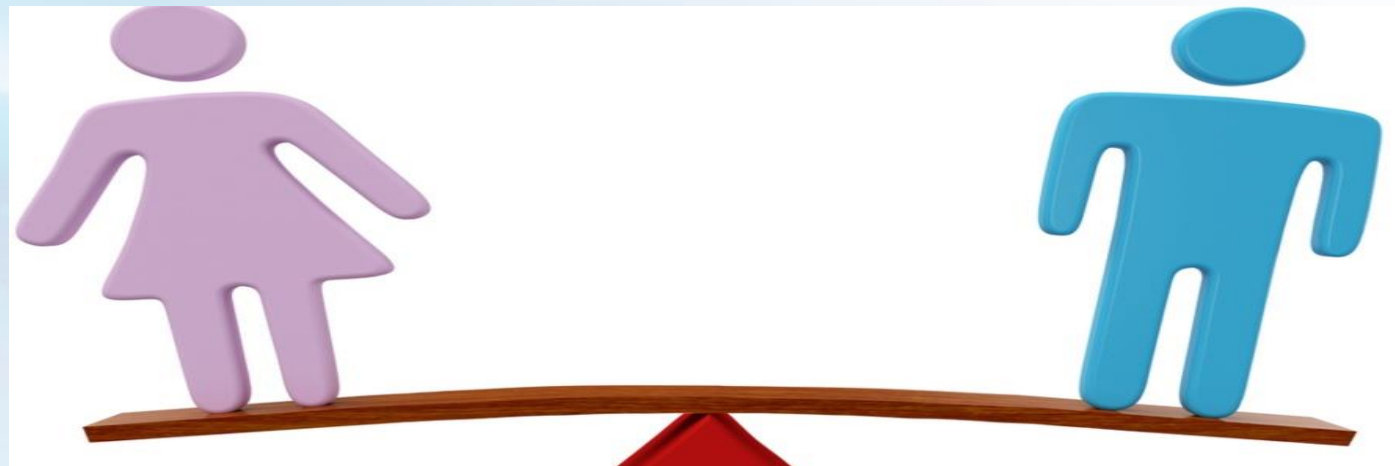

Who Can Participate?

Minimum conditions

✓ **Standard collaborative actions**

At least **three legal entities** each established in a different Member State or an Associated Country;

✓ **ERC, SME instrument, programme co-fund, coordination and support, training and mobility actions:**

One legal entity established in a Member State or in an Associated Country.

Additional Conditions

In the WP or work plan - always check the WP

- ✓ There might be specific conditions for participation
- ✓ e.g SME involvement is an evaluation criteria

Who Can Get Funding?

All participants from:

- Member States
- Associated Countries (Agreement with EU eg. Iceland, Norway, Israel, Serbia, Candidate Countries, case of Switzerland)
- Participants from Third Countries
 - *International Cooperation Partner Countries (ICPC) (Developing & Emerging Economies, MPC, EECA)*
 - *where identified in the Calls for Proposals*

**High Income Countries are
generally not eligible**

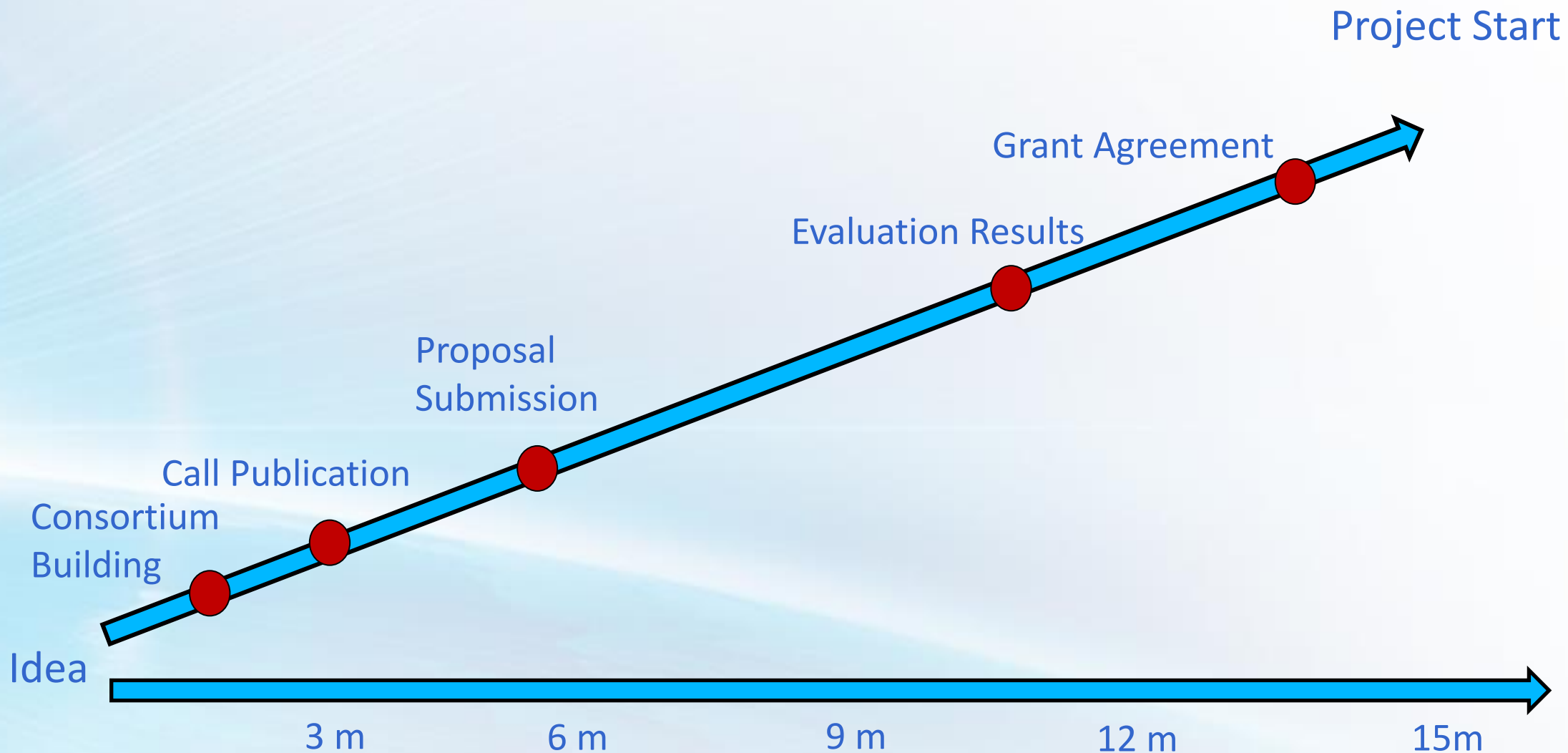



Specific challenge: In 2012 a new Regulation on the quality schemes for agricultural products and foodstuffs was adopted in the EU. Important pillars of the EU quality policy are the 'protected designation of origin' (PDO)/'protected geographical indication' (PGI)/'traditional specialty guaranteed' (TSG) schemes, a scheme for optional quality terms and organic food and farming. They are meant to maintain a large variety of agricultural products, reflecting the diversity of EU agriculture and to allow remunerative prices to producers. The policy is expected to play an important role especially in disadvantaged and remote territories where agriculture is a prominent economic activity. On the other hand, the European public sector is emerging as a powerful actor in the food chain notably through public procurement policies which can create new markets and foster the development of an 'economy of quality'. Innovative approaches in this area are multiplying in various parts of Europe from different types of governance (communal, regional, etc.). These approaches cater for different objectives such as improving the nutritional balance

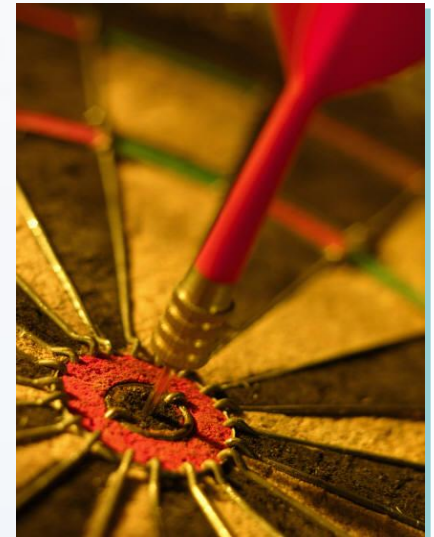

→ So, **Work-Plan** and Phases of Work,
as well as **Means/ Resources** to be utilized.

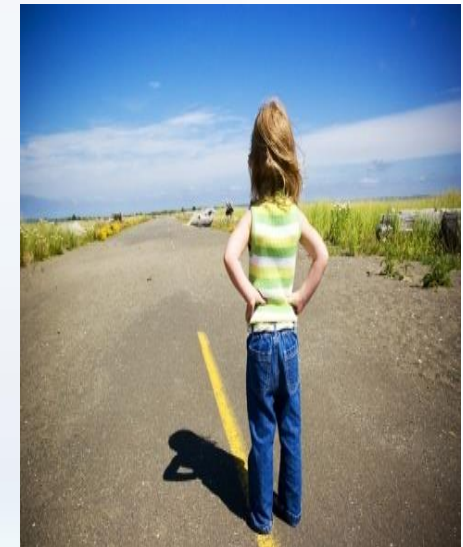
