- This study is part of the National Strategy for the Prevention and Management of Violence in School (2018-2022).
- It has been approved by the Centre for Educational Research and Evaluation (Cyprus Pedagogical Institute), the Cyprus National Bioethics Committee (CNBC), and the Commissioner for Personal Data Protection.

Indicative Results

The results are based on prior reports from the 1st (2020-2021) and 2nd (2021-2022) phase of data collection and concern the number of participants.

School violence and victimization:

- The percentage of teachers observing violence between students remains high during the second phase (More than 95%)
- 1 in 4 students stated that they are a victim of bullying both at school and online
- Victims of school violence experience increased levels of anxiety and depression. Students' anxiety, marginalization, and impulsivity increased the likelihood of violent outbursts

Factors that reduce the occurrence of violent behavior and protect students from victimization:

- resilience,
- the ability to regulate emotions,
- support from family and peers, and
- a positive school climate.

The quality of life of students, families and teachers is influenced by school violence.
